
This is among the world's unique temples, where Lord Shankar's face is worshipped.

Talking about the scriptures, along with religion, many temples of Lord Shankar are established in the country and world where Bholenath sits in a unique style. One of these is the Rudranath temple included in Panch Kedar which is located in the Chamoli district of Uttarakhand.

One of the toughest lord Shiva Temple trek..

This temple of Lord Shankar is situated at an altitude of 3600 meters above sea level. The most special thing about this temple is that the face of Lord Shiva is worshipped here. Not only this, but it is also even more special than the rest of the body of Lord Shiva is worshipped in Kathmandu, Nepal. Yes, this is the reason that this temple is very popular in the country.

This temple is also known as Pashupatinath Temple, since Rudranath is different from other temples, so people come from far away to visit this temple. While Shiva's lingam form is worshipped, only his face is worshipped in this temple. According to beliefs, the face of Lord Shiva is there in this temple and it is known as 'Neelkanth Mahadev'.

Rare Stone Statue

It is said that in the huge natural cave near Rudranath temple, a rare stone statue of Lord Shiva is seen in the temple. In which Lord Shiva appears to his devotees with a crooked neck. It is popularly believed that this rare idol of Mahadev, the God of the Gods, is Swayambhu and to date, no depth could be ascertained.

According to the stories, after the Mahabharata war, the Pandavas wanted to get rid of their sins. For this, he went to Shri Krishna and wanted to know the solution from him. Then Lord Krishna advised the Pandavas to go to the shelter of Lord Shankar.

Rudranath is the highly revered temple of Lord Shiva is peacefully adorned in the Garhwal Himalayas. It is the fourth temple to visit in the circuit of Panch Kedar pilgrimage.

The celestial temple is snuggled inside the rhododendron forests and the alpine meadows. The exhilarating trek to Rudranath temple can be either commenced from Sagar village, Helang or Urgam village.

Rudranath temple is the toughest one to reach in comparison with other temples of Panch Kedar. The Himalayan peaks adding to the glory of Rudranath are Nanda Devi, Trishul and Nanda Ghunti.



Bedni Bugyal Trek

No of Days: 4D/3N (Sagar to Sagar)



Day 1 : Arrive in Sagar Village (1568m)

Arrive in Sagar Village (base of Rudranath trek). If time permits you can also visit the village or temple dedicated to Sagar.

Night stay at hotel/homestay in Sagar village.

Day 2 : Sagar Village- Pitradhar (2800 m)

We will start our trekking from Sagar village early in the morning. After 2 hours of trekking, we will reach Pun Bugyal. After Pun, you will be crossing on the densest forests in the region with many streams in between.

You will reach Panar Bugyal you can roll on the soft carpeted grasslands of the area. After a few kms of the trek, you will reach the ridge area named "Pitradhar" from where you can see views of the Himalayas on both sides which include Chaukhamba peaks, Kedarnath, etc.

Stay in Pitradhar or Panchganga in shack or dome tents.

You cannot conquer a mountain, for it shall continue to exist beyond you. However, if not careful, a mountain can conquer you.

Day 3: Pitradhar/Panchaganga to Rudranath to Liti Bugyal (3305 m)

Today we will trek downhill for 1 km from here and to reach Naola pass then again start trekking for 4 kms to reach Rudranath.

After spending some quality time in Rudranath, we will have our packed lunch over there. We will trek back to Liti Bugyal after lunch.

Day 4: Liti Bugyal to Sagar (7-8 hours/ 250 km)

Have breakfast and travel back to Sagar and board tour taxi for Rishikesh with happy memories of Rudranath Trek

Cancellation Policy

 - Before 30 days: 90% of the total Land Package Cost is refundable

 - Between 11–20 days: 50% of the total Land Package Cost is refundable
 - Less than 10 days: No refund
- Refund will be processed within 10 working days after the cancellation date.
